Felted hot pad recipe for an (approximately!) 8.5"x8.5" square hot pad:

Use a size 10.5-11 needle. Cast on 30 stitches and knit a garter stitch square using bulky weight feltable fiber. Weave in ends a bit. Have a pot of very hot water standing by to supplement the hot water you start with. Use rubber gloves, put a dollop of dish soap in a bowl of hot water and start massaging the fiber (squeeze, rub, beat it up!). Add more hot water as the liquid cools. At first the fabric stretches, but as it felts it starts to feel more solid. Keep rubbing etc. until the ridges of the garter stitch disappear. (For some colors of wool the ridges may not fully disappear.). Rinse thoroughly with cold water. I take the felted object and lay it in a towel to stand on to wring out as much water as possible, then pin it out to dry, stretching it a bit to make the shape as right-angled as possible
